Corporate statement Banned substances

We do not put anything banned by the World Anti-Doping Agency, WADA, (the official agency to monitor banned substances) into our products.

Our products are safe when taken according to the dosage on the label,.

Banned substances Q&A

1) Are there any known cases of professional athletes who took an anti-doping test whilst consuming Nutrilite products? What were the results?

A) To our knowledge, no one has ever received a positive anti-doping test as a result of taking our products. If someone is concerned about the supplements they are taking, they should talk with their doctor.

2) Have we ever studied athletes taking Nutrilite products?

A) We have not done any studies specifically with athletes.

3) Is there an Amway market that has an anti-doping certificate for the Nutrilite Products? (Supported by the IOC)

A) There are no anti-doping certificates given by any sports or anti-doping organizations. However, the International Olympic Committee and other sports agencies recognize the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) as the official agency to monitor banned substances. Our supplements do not have any ingredients that are currently banned by the WADA.

A) The International Olympic Committee and other sports agencies recognise the World Anti-doping Agency (WADA) as the official agency to monitor banned substances. WADA's mission statement says it was created to promote, coordinate, and monitor at the international level the fight against doping in sport in all its forms. 7) Are our products free of forbidden substances? (Forbidden by the IOC)

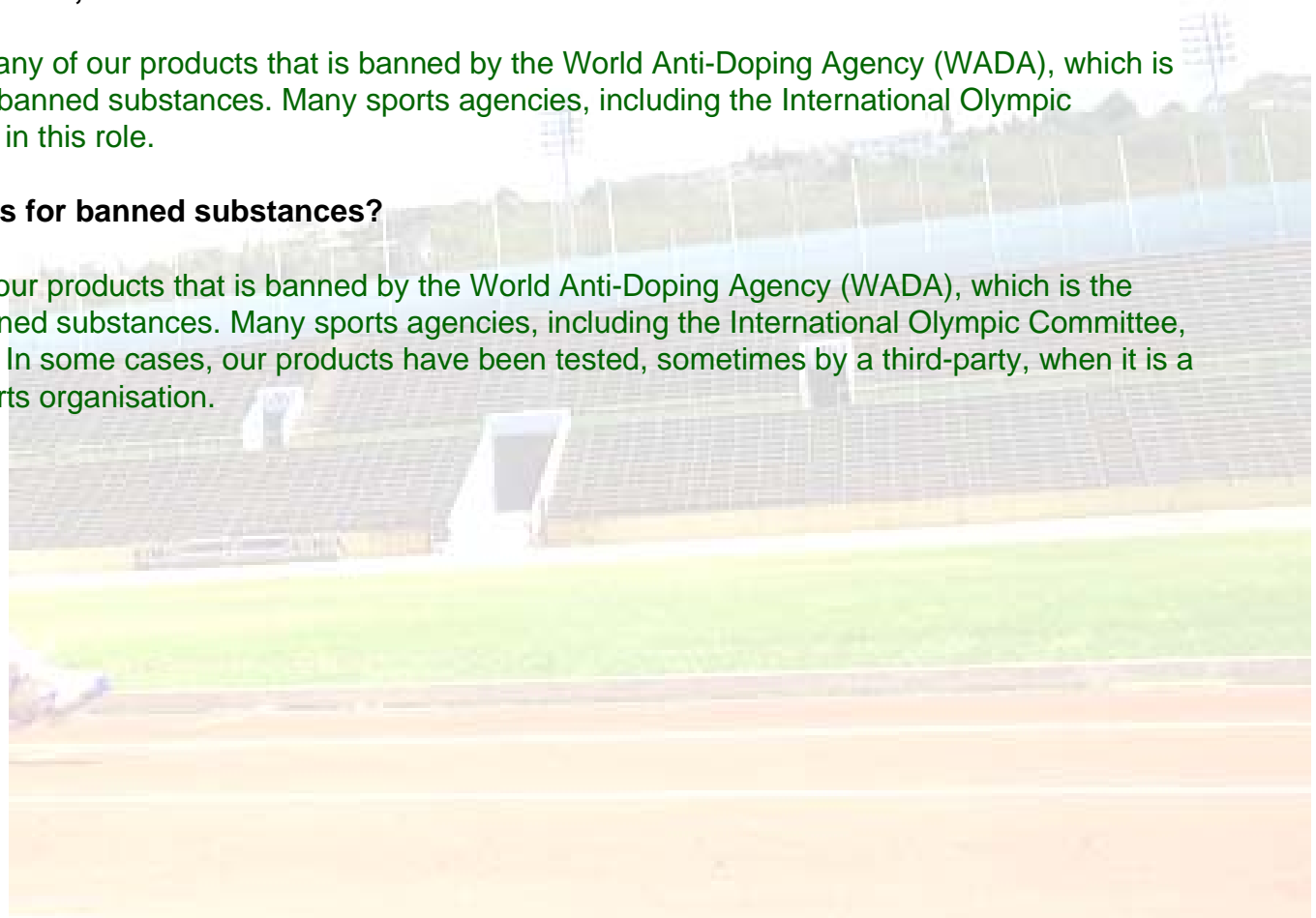
